



# 80 DISCOVERY TRAIL



**ABBOTSFORD** Paved separated trail, quiet shared roads, some bike lanes on busy roads **18km - 40km**



The Discovery Trail winds from park to park from the west side of Abbotsford to Sumas Mountain. It's especially nice in the fall with views of Mt Baker. There are two sections to the trail: West and East. Do one, do the whole thing – you will see a lot of the beautiful Abbotsford countryside.

## DISCOVERY TRAIL WEST • 9km one way • 18km return

START at Gardner Park - Abbotsford

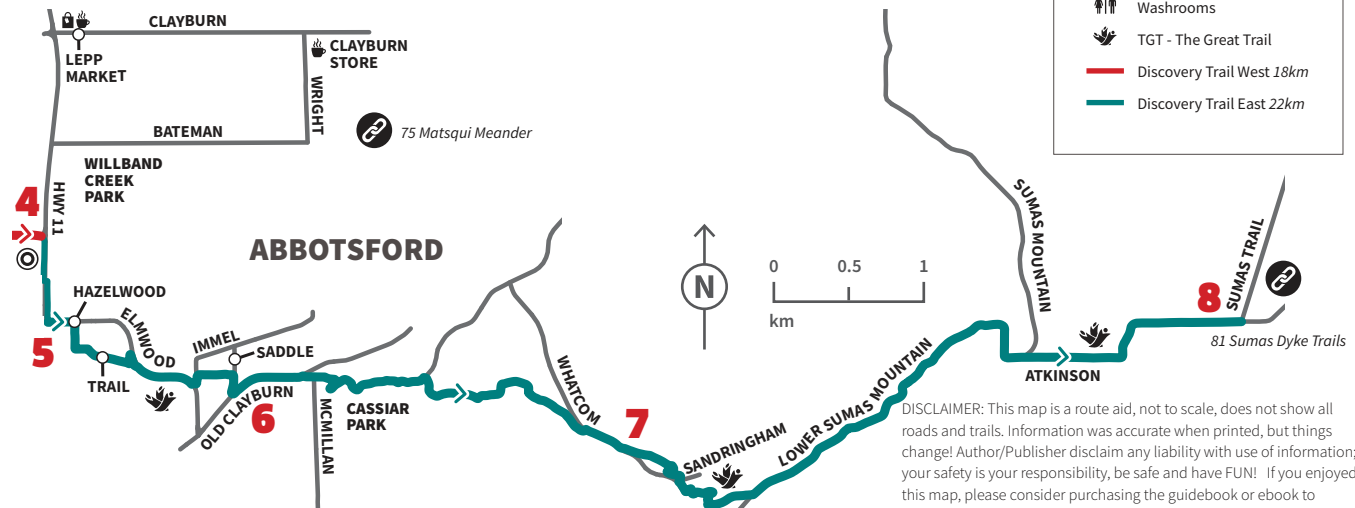
- 1 RIGHT/E on trail - east side of pond
- 2 Cross Maclure, continue on trail
- 3 Enter Clearbrook Park, EAST on trail, \*Exhibition Park, cross Gladwin, through Old Riverside Park, then boardwalks
- 4 At Valley and Hwy 11, return via same route or continue on Discovery Trail East \*lunch at Clayburn Store or Lepp Market



## DISCOVERY TRAIL EAST • 11km one way • 22km return

START at Hwy 11 & Hazelwood- Abbotsford

- 5 RIGHT/S Hwy 11, at McCallum cross at light, RIGHT/S Hwy 11 on east shoulder, LEFT/E Hazelwood, RIGHT on TGT trail
- 6 At Immel cross intersection, quick LEFT then EAST on Discovery Trail, RIGHT/S Saddle, LEFT/E Old Clayburn through Cassiar Park
- 7 Watch for trail signage: cross Whatcom, LEFT on trail, cross Sandringham, TGT trail, LEFT/E Walter, LEFT Lower Sumas Mountain, LEFT/E Sumas Mtn, LEFT/E Atkinson
- 8 At Sumas Dyke Trail, return via same route
